AUTHOR PROFILES



IRVING BERLIN (Music and Lyrics) died at age 101 on Sept. 22, 1989, making 2019 the 30th anniversary of his passing. He left behind a catalogue that boasts more than 1000 songs, epitomized by Jerome Kern's famous maxim: "Irving Berlin has

no place in American music -- he is American music." Born Israel Beilin as one of eight children, his family lived in Tolochin, Byelorussia prior to immigrating to New York in 1893. When his father died, Berlin, just turned 13, took to the streets in various odd jobs, working as a busker singing for pennies, then as a singing waiter in a Chinatown Cafe. In 1907 he published his first song, "Marie from Sunny Italy," and by 1911 he had his first major international hit "Alexander's Ragtime major international hit "Alexander's Ragtime Band." Over the next five decades, he produced an outpouring of ballads, dance numbers, novelty tunes and love songs that defined American popular song for much of the century, including such standards as "How Deep Is the Ocean,"
"Blue Skies," "White Christmas," "Always," "Anything You Can Do I Can Do Better," "There's No Business Like Show Business," "Cheek to ""There's Cheek," "Puttin' on the Ritz," "A Pretty Girl Is Like a Melody," "Heat Wave," "Oh! How I Hate to Get Up in the Morning," "Easter Parade" and "Let's Face the Music and Dance." And in a class by itself is his beloved paean to his beloved country, "God Bless America," as so often belted out by singer Kate Smith. He wrote 17 complete scores for Broadway musicals and revues, and contributed material to six more as well as the

scores to dozens of beloved Hollywood movie musicals. He won a special Tony Award (1963) and the Academy Award for Best Song of the Year for "White Christmas" in 1942. He died in his sleep in his town house in New York City, a widower since his wife of 62 years, the former Ellin Mackay, had died the previous year at the age of 85. He is survived by three daughters and their families.

DAVID IVES (Book) was nominated for a Tony Award for Best Play for Venus in Fur, which has been produced all over the country and the world, and was turned into a film by Roman Polanski. He is also well known for his evenings of one-act comedies All in the Timing and Time Flies. Other plays include New Jerusalem: The Interrogation of Baruch de Spinoza; The Liar (adapted from Corneille); The School for Lies (adapted from Molière); The Metromaniacs (adapted from Alexis Piron); Is He Dead? (adapted from Mark Twain); Ancient History; and Polish Joke. A Chicago native, he lives in New York City.

PAUL BLAKE (Book) has served as Executive Producer of the St. Louis Muny since 1990; which with 11,350 seats, makes the Muny America's largest theatre. At the Muny, where Irving Berlin's "White Christmas" began in Summer 2000, Mr. Blake has produced over 150 productions, which during the years starred such legends as Phyllis Diller, Captain Kangaroo, and the Radio City Rockettes. His musical Roman Holiday, with a score by Cole Porter, had its American premiere at The Guthrie Theatre in Minneapolis in the summer of 2012.

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MATT EDMONDS (Bob Wallace) returns to TATC, where you may have seen him in Forever Plaid, Pump Boys and Dinettes, or Big River. A Chicago native, he's been performing in Chicagoland for 10 years. Most recently, he appeared in *Into* the Woods (Writers Theatre). Other recent work includes: Murder For Two (Marriott Lincolnshire & Milwaukee Repertory), It's a Wonderful Life: Live in Chicago (American Blues Theatre), Ragtime (Griffin Theatre), Death of a Salesman (Redtwist Theatre, Jeff Nomination for Best Supporting Actor Play), Rent (Theo Ubique, Jeff Award for Best Musical), James and the Giant Peach (Drury Lane Oakbrook), Titanic (Griffin Theatre), and The Last Five Years (Metropolis Performing Arts Center). Regionally, Matt's performed in Next To Normal (TheatreSquared) and Twelfth Night (Notre Dame Shakespeare Festival). He is a company member at Redtwist Theater, and is represented by Shirley Hamilton Talent.

JUSTIN BRILL (*Phil Davis*) is thrilled that *White Christmas* is his third show at TATC after playing Dennis in *All Shook Up* (a role he understudied and performed in the original Broadway company) and

Jimmy, also teamed with Erica Stephan, in Nice Work If You Can Get It. In recent years he has performed at Drury Lane (Amos in Chicago and Bert in 42nd Street), at Marriott Theatre, The Fireside Theatre and Milwaukee Rep. Prior to moving to Chicago, Justin lived in NY and performed on Broadway in other shows including Rent and High Fidelity as well as at The Metropolitan Opera, National Tours (Boq in Wicked and Lefou in Disney's Beauty and the Beast), the Las Vegas Strip (Monty Python's Spamalot and Mamma Mia!) as well as regional theatres around the country. Currently he is on the Musical Theatre faculty of Columbia College Chicago where he also directs the yearly new student MT Showcase in the fall.
